INTRODUCTION

The Martha Rivers Adams Collection centers on the Paine, Abernathy, Rivers, and Brown families from Giles County, Tennessee. The Martha Rivers Adams Collection was assembled mainly by Martha Rivers Adams, and was donated to the Tennessee State Library and Archives by her nephew, Douglas C. Macleod.

The collection occupies .84 cubic feet of shelf space, and numbers approximately 300 items. Single photocopies of unpublished writings in the Martha Rivers Adams Collection may be made for purposes of scholarly research.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Martha Rivers Adams Collection, containing approximately 300 items, consists of original material from 1751-1902, and centers on the Rivers, Paine, Abernathy, and Brown families of Giles County, Tennessee. It includes agreements, Civil War items, correspondence, land records, ledgers, lists, obituaries, poems, promissory notes, a will, and several miscellaneous items.

The bulk of the collection, consisting of correspondence, business and general; land records, grants and deeds; and miscellaneous receipts, was gathered by Martha Rivers Adams, a historian and writer of a column for the Lynchburg, Virginia newspaper in the 1940's and 1950's. After her death, the information passed to her son, William Duvall Adams, and then, upon his death, to a nephew, Douglas C. MacLeod.

The majority of business correspondence concerns Milton Paine's dealings with various creditors to whom he owed money. These various letter are addressed to Milton Paine's father, James Paine, who appeared to be handling the matter.

General correspondence is family in nature. Among the more interesting letters are those written by Methodist Bishop Robert Paine (1799-1882) to various family members between 1840-1878. While not of significant historical importance, the letters provide insight into some of the prevailing issues of the day--slavery, sickness, and daily survival.

There is an assortment of Civil War documents contained in the collection, including an 1864 Confederate Military Pass allowing a Miss Barber to receive medical attention and visit an imprisoned brother in the north.

Receipts in the collection are varied in nature and cover a wide time-span, 1751-1902.

Several poems, written by J.P. Rivers, are contained in the collection. They appear to have been written during the Civil War period.
