Chesley and J. C. Williams Papers, 1848-1920

COLLECTION SUMMARY

Scope & Content:

Consists of receipts, correspondence, legal documents, and ledger scraps, spanning the period 1848-1920. Chesley Williams and two of his sons, J.C. and R. E., amassed these documents throughout their lives and careers.

The receipts are arranged chronologically by year. Among them is an excellent collection of 19th and 20th century letterheads depicting buildings and stores whose façade or image might never have been captured in photographs. Subscription receipts to the *Murfreesboro News* (1873, 1882), *Franklin Review and Journal* (1875, 1876, 1881), *The American* (1875, 1877, 1880), *The Free Press* (Chattanooga, 1888) are included. Researchers interested in matters of law will find receipts for court services including issuing warrants, judgements, and docketings. There are a number of Chesley's toll gate receipts for traveling along the Eagleville-Unionville Turnpike. Tax receipts from Williamson, Davidson, Rutherford, and Bedford counties reside within this section. Among the receipts are those related to the estate of Major Thomas Carlton--including his coffin. Carlton, a War of 1812 veteran, died in 1863.

The majority of correspondence relates to the Williams's general store or Chesley's legal practice. U. S. Representative James D. Richardson wrote to Chesley Williams in 1886 soliciting campaign donations. Tennessee State Representative John Lytle shared his opinion regarding the constitutionality of charter laws. An acquaintance, F. M. Jackson, apprised Chesley of a legislative

matter on Tennessee Congressional letterhead. Civil War researchers will find a rejected claim for reimbursement by former state Representative John Morgan Bright on behalf of Chesley Williams.

The legal documents are arranged by type and contain material that Chesley accumulated over his career as an attorney. Documents include wills, estate papers, agreements, and other items related to court cases.

Administrative/Biographical History

Chesley Williams was born in Williamson County, Tennessee, on July 22, 1809. In the early 1830s, he moved to Eagleville to establish his own general store. There, he served as Eagleville's second postmaster. Chesley enjoyed a long career as an attorney, and was stockholder in the Eagleville and Salem Turnpike and majority stockholder in the Eagleville and Unionville Turnpike. He married Elizabeth Jordan in 1830, and they had 9 children. Chesley is known as the "father of Eagleville" for his vast land ownership and contributions to the city. He died in Eagleville on August 9, 1892, and is buried in Jordan Cemetery in Eagleville, Rutherford County.

James Chesley Williams was born in Eagleville, Tennessee, on September 22, 1842. He enlisted in the Confederate Army on September 30, 1862, as a private in the 11th Tennessee Cavalry, Co. C. J. C. was captured at Middleton, Tennessee on January 31, 1863, and imprisoned at City Point, Virginia and Fort McHenry,

Maryland. By the end of 1863, he resumed his service after a prisoner exchange. After the war he and his brother Robert worked at their father's store and ultimately took over after his death. J. C. died on November 6, 1913, in Eagleville.
