# Clarkson Family Papers, 1779-1947

#### **COLLECTION SUMMARY**

#### **Creator:**

#### **Scope & Content:**

Consists of approximately 335 items, including 135 photographs, and spans the years 1779-1947. The bulk of the collection covers the years 1868 to 1916. A large part of the collection centers on the fund-raising efforts to build a monument in the memory of Sam Davis, who was hanged at Pulaski, Tennessee, after being convicted as a spy for the Confederate Army. Some of the correspondence belongs to Mr. T. A. Clarkson, who was associated with the Nashville and Decatur Railroad, and later with the Nashville, Chattanooga, and St. Louis Railroad.

Also included in the collection are various items associated with the Tennessee Centennial Exposition, such as programs, passes, an account book for the admissions department, memorabilia, charter and by-laws for the Centennial Exposition of Tennessee, and other items. Other subjects addressed in the collection are the Nashville, Chattanooga, and St. Louis Railroad, the John W. Thomas Monument at what is now Centennial Park, and the tributes paid to Major E. C. Lewis.

The collection also includes numerous photographs featuring subjects such as the Christ Episcopal Church and the First Presbyterian Church in Nashville, Tennessee; The Hermitage in Hermitage, Tennessee; the statue of Andrew Jackson at the State Capitol; the summer home of Bishop E. E. Hoss; railroad scenes; scenes of Nashville; identified and unidentified individuals, as well as several miscellaneous photographs. The collection also holds several World War II service pins.

#### Administrative/Biographical History

The Clarkson Family Papers, 1779-1947, focus on Thomas A. Clarkson, who was involved with the fund-raising efforts for the statue of Sam Davis in Smyrna, Tennessee. Thomas A. Clarkson was born around 1872 in North Carolina. By 1920, he lived in Nashville, Tennessee, and was married to Sarah E. Clarkson. Their son, Thomas A. Clarkson, Jr., was born in 1911. By 1940, Thomas A. Clarkson had remarried to Bessie W. Clarkson. Clarkson was a secretary for various railroads including the North Pacific Coast Railroad and Linman Railroad.
