INTRODUCTION

This collection comprises clippings, copies of correspondence and photographs concerning James O. Davis, the first chief of the Tennessee Highway Patrol.

The materials in this collection measure approximately 50 items. There are no restrictions on the materials. Single photocopies of unpublished writings in the James Orren Davis Papers may be made for purposes of individual or scholarly research.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The James Orren Davis Papers, approximately 50 items, are composed of photographs, clippings and copies of correspondence. Most of the material concerns the Tennessee Highway Patrol during its infancy, ca. 1930-1932. Davis was the first chief of the Patrol which was created in 1929.
