INTRODUCTION

The Derryberry-Hardison-Lovett Papers (1825-1928) are centered around families from Maury County, Tennessee. The Derryberry-Hardison-Lovett papers are a gift of Eula Lovett, Spring Hill, Tennessee. The collection occupies .21 of shelf space, and contains approximately 150 items. Single copies of unpublished writings in the Derryberry, Hardison, Lovett Papers may be made for purposes of scholarly research.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Derryberry-Hardison-Lovett Papers span the period 1825-1928. The collection consists of accounts, an application, cards, correspondence, genealogy, land records, a marriage record, photographs, a program, and a transcript of documents in the collection.

Most of the collection is family oriented in nature. The Derryberry, Hardison, and Lovett families are related through marriage.

Of special interest is the application to place "Pineview", the Derryberry house in Maury County, Tennessee, on the National Register of Historic Places.
