INTRODUCTION

This finding aid focuses on the papers of Curtis Brabson Haley, book editor for the Methodist Publishing House in Nashville, Tennessee. Spanning the years 1888-1951, the papers contain much correspondence between Haley and other family members as well as business letters relating to his work as book editor and treasurer of the Methodist Benevolent Association. The collection also includes fragmented diaries of Dr. Haley. Other items within the collection include documents relating to the Fleet of the Sailors, a fraternity for insurance men, and the Methodist Benevolent Association.

The papers of Dr. Haley were donated by his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Curtis B. Haley, Jr. The unprocessed materials had been stored for many years in conditions which lacked humidity and temperature control prior to their donation to the Tennessee State Library and Archives.

The processed collection measures approximately seven and one-half cubic feet, excluding a small box of photographs housed in the vault of the State Library and Archives. There are no restrictions on the material. Single photocopies of unpublished materials in the Haley Papers may be made for individual or scholarly research.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Curtis Brabson Haley Papers containing approximately 1100 items, span the period 1888-1951. The collection is composed of account books, announcements, associations, institutions, etc., certificates, clippings, correspondence, diaries, memoirs, etc., estate papers, financial records, genealogical data, land records, legal documents, McKendree Methodist Church records, obituaries, pictorial post cards, programs, school records, tours, and several miscellaneous items.

A major portion of the collection consists of correspondence, which is separated into two groups, family and general. General correspondence generally consists of business letters relating to Haley's work as book editor at the Methodist Publishing House, and as treasurer of the Methodist Benevolent Association. One prominent correspondent is Herbert Hoover, who writes a letter of appreciation in response to Haley's congratulatory message after the former's election to the presidency in 1928 (see Box 11, Folder 4).

Financial records relate to the Lawrence M. Hirsig and Co., in Nashville, Tennessee. Mr. Hirsig was a brother-in-law of Mrs. Maude McBryde Haley, the wife of Dr. Haley.

Genealogical information in the collection may be found for the following families: Branson, Haley, McBryde, and Shields.

Records for the McKendree Methodist Church include history, minutes, reports, resolutions, and trust funds for the period 1929-1946. There is a large assortment of pictorial post cards in the collection of points of interest in the United States and foreign countries visited by Dr. Haley and his correspondents.

An interesting portion of the collection are the documents found in Dr. Haley's tour of the Holy Land and western European countries in 1935. Traveling to the Mediterranean areas on the Italian line, "Conte Di Savoia," and returning on the "Rex," there may be found itineraries, a ship deck plan diagram, programs and menus, and most important, extensive notes by Dr. Haley on his travels and observation (see Box 15, Folder 20 and Box 17, Folder 3).

Among the oversize materials is a photograph featuring the founders and pioneers of Methodism in America.

Box 18 are documents which were inadvertently omitted when the collection was initially processed and arranged. Also included in the revised collection are genealogical charts for the Haley and McBryde families.

The Curtis B. Haley Papers provide information on Methodism in Nashville, Tennessee, in the early half of the twentieth century through the work and observation of one of its literary editors.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Curtis Brabson Haley

1872	September 11, born at Marietta, Georgia, the son of Dr. James F. and Priscilla Shields Haley.
1892	June, graduated from the State Normal School at Jacksonville, Alabama.
1893	February 15, began work at the Methodist Publishing House as a printer and worked successively as linotype operator, foreman of the <i>Christian</i> <i>Advocate</i> , general proof reader, and chief proof reader.
1900	December 19, married Mary Wheeler Flippen, who died March 4, 1902.
1905	October, married Maude McBryde of Nashville.
1919-1941	Assistant to the book editor and editor of the Quarterly Review.
1926-	Treasurer of the Methodist Benevolent Association.
1951	April 23, died in Brentwood, Tennessee, and interred in Mt. Olivet
	Cemetery, Nashville, Tennessee.

Honors and Organizations

Honorary Doctor of Letters degree from Birmingham Southern College.

Bronze medal from National Council of Boy Scouts for helping save three boys from drowning in Cumberland River.

First scoutmaster in Nashville and served for 24 years as master of Nashville Troop 1. Boy Scout Silver Beaver Medal for "distinguished service to boyhood."

Helped organize the Fleet of Sailors, a fraternity for insurance men, and served as Chief Supercargo for 38 years.
