INTRODUCTION

The Thomas Fearn Perkins Henderson Papers (1795-1960), Addition, 1802-1957 are centered around Thomas Fearn Perkins Henderson (1882-1966), lawyer, of Franklin, Tennessee. The Thomas Fearn Perkins Henderson Papers--Addition are a gift of Thomas Perkins Henderson, Nashville, Tennessee.

The collection occupies 16.8 cubic feet of shelf space, and contains approximately 415 items. Single photocopies of unpublished writings in the Thomas Fearn Perkins Henderson Papers, Addition may be made for purposes of scholarly research.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Thomas Fearn Perkins Henderson Papers, Addition, containing approximately 415 items, span the period 1802-1957, although the bulk is largely concentrated in the years 1920-1945. The collection is composed of correspondence, court records, genealogical data, land records, photographs, slavery items (bills of sale) and several miscellaneous items.

The majority of the collection consists of correspondence. The correspondence is divided into four different sections: business and general; family; legal; and court correspondence. Within the business and general correspondence is a letter from Governor Prentice Cooper (1895-1969) of Tennessee appointing Thomas F. P. Henderson (1882-1966) to the Arbitration Board for Williamson County to assist in the adjudication of claims expected to result from damages caused by Army maneuvers in Middle Tennessee in 1942 (Box 1, Folder 3). A large number of the family letters are from Mary ("Mary Sam") Smithson Perkins (1876-____), a cousin, of Henderson. Mr. Henderson was administrator of the estate of Mrs. Perkin's late husband, Newton Cannon Perkins (1869-1924) and later managed Mrs. Perkin's real estate holdings in Franklin, Tennessee.

The historical value of the collection is in the numerous photographs. Several photographs depict units of the U. S. Army in encampment in the United States and also in service in France during the First World War. There is a substantial number of smaller photographs with captions that provide an overview of the war on the Western Front in France. Thomas Henderson served as a Captain in the 114th Field Artillery and several pictures show Henderson and his comrades including Colonel Luke Lea (1879-1945). There are also many unidentified photographs.

The Thomas Fearn Perkins Henderson Papers--Addition supplement the earlier collection of the Thomas P. Henderson Papers in the Tennessee State Library and Archives (see Ms. Ac. No's 68-280 and 89-12).
