INTRODUCTION

This finding aid focuses on the papers of Rev. Willard Harris Blue, Methodist pastor, born at Bethpage, Tennessee. Spanning the years 1915-1960, the papers contain numerous sermons delivered by Rev. Blue during the years 1927-1958 at various Methodist churches which he served in Middle Tennessee, particularly in Clarksville, Murfreesboro, and Nashville. Also contained within the collection are diaries of Rev. Blue between 1928-1948 as well as several miscellaneous items.

Rev. Blue also played an important role in the late 1950s in spearheading the drive to establish a facility in the Nashville area for retired Methodists. His dream for such a retirement home became a reality in the early 1960s in Hermitage with McKendree Village.

The materials in this finding aid measure 4 cubic feet. There are no restrictions on the materials. Single photocopies of unpublished writings in the Willard Harris Blue Papers may be made for scholarly research.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Willard Harris Blue Papers, containing approximately 1,500 items, span the period 1915-1960. The collection is composed of church bulletins and sermons, clippings, correspondence, diaries, genealogical data, speeches, and several miscellaneous items.

The bulk of the collection consists of church bulletins and sermons delivered by Rev. Blue while serving respectively at Waverly Place Methodist Church, Nashville, Tennessee, Madison Street Methodist church, Clarksville, Tennessee, First Methodist Church, Murfreesboro, Tennessee, Calvary Methodist church, Nashville, Tennessee, and as guest preacher at various other Methodist Churches in Middle Tennessee. Rev. Blue's sermons have been arranged chronologically with the applicable church bulletins. In those instances where the dates of the sermons could not be determined, the sermons were arranged in folders marked "date unknown," accompanied by a list of sermon topics.

Rev. Blue kept a diary for the years 1928-1948. Entries were made meticulously for each day of the year providing information on such subjects as weather, Sunday sermons delivered, church attendance, weddings performed, visits made in the parish, etc.

Valuable genealogical information may also be found on such families as Blake, Blue, Cummins, Draper, Gray, and Pate.
