## INTRODUCTION

The records in Record Group 273, Tennessee Department of Education, span the period 1874-1987, although the bulk of the collection is concentrated in the 1930s through the 1950s. The record group consists of applications, correspondence, various kinds of reports, and subject files reflecting the many activities of the Department of Education.

The records came to the Tennessee State Library and Archives through two sources. The earliest records were transferred directly from the offices of the Department of Education, while later additions were transferred from the State Records Center. The final disposition of the collection was determined by the Records Disposition Authorization (RDA) process. In accordance with the RDA, all the material in Record Group 273 has been microfilmed and the originals were disposed of by state approved methods.

Record Group 273 measured approximately 176 cubic feet. Records removed and destroyed during processing were duplicate copies and routine office correspondence was sampled. Photographs were removed after microfilming, and the originals were preserved in RG 273A. One box of Commissioner McElrath's files was added in December 2019 as Box 176. It, along with Box 175, are not microfilmed but contain original records.

Record Group 273 should be used in conjunction with other record groups relating to the Department of Education. Researchers should consult Record Group 26, Schoolhouse Planning in Tennessee; Record Group 91, State Board of Education; Record Group 92, Commissioner of Education Records; Record Group 245, State Board of Education Minutes; Record Group 246, Department of Education Certification Commission; and Record Group 254, Department of Education Program of Teacher Preparation.

## **The Tennessee Department of Education: Beginnings, 1835-1873**

When the second Constitution of Tennessee was adopted in 1835, the “common school system” was without any responsible centralized authority operating at either the state or local level. Up until that time, the common schools were without adequate funds, devoid of any responsible administration, “stigmatized by the taint of pauperism,” and were allegedly served by bureaucrats whose services were not deemed worthy of compensation. The idea of mass education at public expense was entertained by only a handful of citizens whose exertions in the legislature had proved futile.

But the question of public education was brought to the floor time after time during the deliberations of the Constitutional Convention that convened in 1834. The 1835 Constitution decreed that “the common school fund shall never be diminished by legislative appropriation.” The constitutional recognition of education was further reinforced a year later by legislative action on February 19, 1836, when it was enacted that “the Treasurer of the State, the Comptroller of the Treasury, and an executive officer, to be called the Superintendent of Public Instruction, shall be and they are hereby created and constituted.”

Complaints and criticisms that the school system was not working forced a General Assembly investigation within three years of the inception of the undertaking. The management of the school fund came in for sharp criticism in a nearly 100-page report in the legislative journals of 1839-1840. Varying rates of discount, interest and fluctuating values of “paper money” in different parts of the state presented difficulties in attempting to invest in and protect the school fund. As a result, the Office of State Superintendent of Public Instruction was abolished on January 12, 1844. The duties of the Superintendent were transferred to the State Treasurer where they remained until after the Civil War.

The Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction was restored by law on March 5, 1867. At the regular election in August 1867, John E. Eaton, Jr. was elected Superintendent of Public Instruction. The salary was \$1,200 per year, and when Eaton reported for duty at the State Capitol, the superintendent of the building “furnished chairs, and a table and a room.” The Comptroller refused to pay for the postage needed for the operation of the office.

Due to the fact that Eaton was a former Union officer, he soon fell victim to violent political opposition. Accusing the Superintendent of fraud and misuse of funds, the General Assembly again abolished the office in 1870. Through the financial assistance in part by the Peabody Education Funds, a Northern philanthropic agency, J. B. Killebrew was appointed Assistant Superintendent of Public Instruction on January 22, 1872. He made a one-man survey of educational conditions in the state, welded his facts into a report to the legislature, and by “taking the stump,” persuaded the people to rally to a reenactment of educational legislation that is today referred to as the “Parent Act of Education” in Tennessee. The Office of Superintendent of Public Education as revived by the law of 1873 remained intact until 1923, when the title was changed to Commissioner of Education.

- 1915 Average yearly salary for teachers in Tennessee was \$247
- 1917 United States Congress passed the Smith-Hughes Act to assist schools that taught vocational agriculture, trades and home economics. In that year Tennessee received \$34,000
- 1921 Tennessee General Assembly passed a County Board of Education Law that provided for the creation of a County Board of Education consisting of 7 members
- 1921 One-third of the counties in Tennessee did not have a senior high school

- 1925 School Law Act of 1925 set the following specifications regarding the subjects to be taught in the public schools: “The course of study shall embrace the following subjects: spelling, reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, history of Tennessee, history of the United States, hygiene and sanitation, physical education, vocal music and drawing. Instruction in hygiene and sanitation shall include the nature of alcoholic drinks, narcotics and smoking of cigarettes and their effects upon the human.”
- 1927 State funds were appropriated to build schools in the counties, as the counties were given complete authority over the funds, little money was used for that purpose
- 1929 The Great Depression in Tennessee forced the State to reduce expenditures for all school purposes. School construction practically ceased. Teachers were compelled to accept largely reduced salaries, and in a majority of cases, the small salaries promised were not paid promptly
- 1930 Tennessee had 375 four-year high schools
- 1933 Governor Hill McAlister created the Tennessee Educational Commission to investigate and advise State government concerning the needs of public education. The final recommendations were reported to the Tennessee General Assembly
- 1934 Commissioner of Education reported that the housing, facilities, and teaching equipment for African American children was far below that for white children. He noted that many of the school buildings were unsafe, and the equipment in many instances was entirely non-existent
- 1937 Program for the standardization of rural elementary schools was adopted by the State Board of Education
- 1938 State Board of Education approved a curriculum for the training of elementary teachers in Tennessee, including all teaching areas prescribed by the state elementary course of study
- 1941 Public Act, Chapter 43, provided educational opportunity for African Americans equal that provided for whites at the University of Tennessee. Higher education in Tennessee would remain segregated

- 1943 School Lunch Program began with the establishment of cafeterias in secondary schools and with the provision in rural schools of a hot dish as a supplement to the food brought from home. In June 1946, the National School Lunch Act made the school lunch program a permanent program
- 1944 Service Man's Re-adjustment Act provided training for veterans of World War II. In 1945 the program became a reality for farm boys, and it was known as "Institutional On-Farm Training." By February 1946, classes were underway in Tennessee
- 1947 Services for Exceptional Children Act was authorized by the General Assembly
- 1947 Thirty-six (36) Tennessee counties were served by the Jeanes Agency and other philanthropic agencies
- 1964 United States Congress passed the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Tennessee began the process of the integration of public schools

## **Divisions in the Department of Education, 1873-1980**

Central Office- includes the Commissioner and the Assistant Commissioner of Education. The Commissioner's duties were to see that the state's school laws were executed; distributed school funds as provided by statute, and protected those funds from loss, misappropriation, of illegal use; directed the staff of the Department in the supervision of the schools; collected and published statistics and other information regarding the schools; required in-service training for teachers; and to provide a full account of the receipts and disbursements of the public school funds, the condition and progress of the schools, and recommendations for improvement of the system. The Assistant Commissioner's duties were related to office personnel, routine office work, and legal matters pertaining to the Department of Education. At one time, the Division of Teachers' Pensions was under the Central Office.

Division of Certification (also called Division of Teacher Education and Certification)- This division cooperated with the colleges approved for teacher training in curricular studies for improvement of the teacher training programs. It reviewed the qualifications of teacher applicants, issued certificates to those eligible for teaching positions, certified county superintendents, and enforced the State Board of Education rules and regulations pertaining to certification and teacher training.

Division of Curriculum and Supervision- The work of this division involved seeing that all phases of the curriculum and instruction met minimum standards set by state law and by the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education.

Division of Elementary Schools- The division supervised public elementary schools and enforced the laws, rules, and regulations pertaining to them. It advised with the staffs of elementary schools for the purpose of promoting proper teaching methods and a standardization of subjects.

Division of Finance and Administrative Services- The division cooperated with local school officials in setting budgets and accounting systems, administered the various funds of the department, provided for the distribution of school funds, and handled the general accounting of the department. It compiled budget estimates prepared by the divisions for legislative appropriations and work programs for approval by the Department of the Budget.

Division of Health Education- This division provided guidance, counseling, and materials to local schools in an effort to improve the health of children in public schools. It administered the tuberculosis education program, and was overseer of the school lunch program.

Division of High Schools- This division supervised high school instruction, recommended curriculums, advised high school teaching staffs, classified high schools,

and issued the proper certificates to graduates depending on the quality of instruction and adequacy of the facilities.

Division of Instructional Administration (also called Division of Instructional Materials and Library Service) - The division administered the program of instructional materials including, at one time, textbooks, library books and services, audio-visual and other teaching aids. The division provided advisory services to local school units in the selection, organization, distribution, and use of instructional and library materials.

Division of Negro Education- The division served as an agent for the General Education Board, the Southern Foundation, the Rosenwald Fund, and other philanthropic agencies. It served as a coordinator between the Department of Education and the institutes of higher education in Tennessee. One of the major duties of the division was the overseeing of the Jeanes Agency. The major aspect of its work was classroom supervision; promotion of industrial work in elementary and high school; and the promotion of community activities by connecting the school with home and community needs. The supervisors were instrumental in teaching skills such as sewing, canning, and other activities. It cooperated with the Division of Schoolhouse Planning and Transportation in matters pertaining to buildings, grounds, and equipment for African Americans.

Division of Research and Statistics- This division conducted research studies relating to special and general aspects of the public school programs. It conducted long-range studies relating to curriculum development. At one time was located under the Central office.

Division of Rural Schools- This division supervised rural schools in accordance with the rules and regulations pertaining to them. It coordinated with the superintendents, supervisors, and teachers in promoting better teaching methods and in improving rural schools. This division was eventually adsorbed into the Division of Public Schools.

Division of School Finances- See Division of Finance and Administrative Services.

Division of Schoolhouse Planning (also called Division of Schoolhouse Planning and Transportation)- This division cooperated with local school boards in the appraisal of sites and in the functional planning of new school buildings and improvements and additions to old buildings. Through a staff of field workers, the division made school building surveys in counties and cities, and then recommendations for new construction. It also enforced regulations pertaining to school buses and student safety.

State Board of Education- The State Board of Education was composed of the Governor, the Commissioner of Education, and nine members appointed by the Governor. Although not a division of the Department of Education, it served as a policy-making body for the

Department, and was directly responsible for the administration and control of state institutions of higher learning (except the University of Tennessee), the Alvin C. York Agricultural Institute, Tennessee School for the Blind, Tennessee School for the Deaf, and the Tennessee Industrial School. The State Board of Education prescribed the specific rules and regulations for the operation of the state minimum school program for counties, cities, and special school districts, which included: a salary schedule for county superintendents; salaries and employment of supervising teachers; salary schedules for certified teachers and principals in public schools; census enumeration; learning and instructional materials, other expenses of instruction and health education services; school plant operation, maintenance, and other general expenses. It also set standards and requirements for the “graded” schools, such as length of school day and school term; organization of the school day; teaching load and teacher-pupil ratio; pupil load; course of study; counseling and guidance services; grading; promotions; graduation, and other similar activities.

State Superintendent of Schools (also called State Superintendent of Public Instruction)- A title variously used for the head of the education system from 1936 to 1923. In 1923, the title was changed to the Commissioner of Education. The duties and responsibilities were similar to that of the Commissioner of Education.

Tennessee Education Commission- Although not a division of the Department of Education, the commission was established to advise and recommend policies for the reform of education in Tennessee. Created in 1933, the Commission was composed of nine members. In 1935, the Commission issued its findings.

Tennessee School for the Blind- The school was located in Nashville. In 1949, the school moved to the old Clover Bottom Farm. A new school was constructed in 1952

Tennessee Textbook Commission (also called Free Textbook Commission)- The commission formulated the rules and regulations in the distribution of free textbooks in the first, second, and third grades of the public schools. It was composed of the Governor, the Commissioner of Education, and the President of the Tennessee Education Association. At various times, it had the authority to adopt texts for use in the elementary and high schools of the State, as well as advertising for bids.

Division of Veteran’s Education- This division was created for the purpose of providing educational and training opportunities for discharged World War II veterans. The division approved and supervised educational institutions and training establishments for returning veterans. In 1953, the division was authorized by the State Board of Education to supervise institutional on-farm training for Korean veterans.

Division of Vocational Education- The Division of Vocational Education cooperated with local public school authorities in maintaining programs of training for specific occupational pursuits. Its mandate included provisions for training for persons already engaged in or preparing to enter agriculture, the sale and distribution of goods and services, homemaking and trade or industrial pursuits.

Division of Vocational Rehabilitation- The duties of this division were threefold; (1) to return to employment persons who had been vocationally handicapped as a result of physical impairments; (2) to prepare persons without employment experience; and (3) to retain in suitable employment physically impaired persons. As part of the overall plan, medical treatments, surgery, hospitalization, training, and job counseling were given.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Record Group 273, Tennessee Department of Education spans the period 1874 to 1984, although the bulk of the collection is concentrated from the 1930s through the 1950s. The collection measured approximately 174 cubic feet of material. In accordance with the Records Disposition Authorization (RDA), the collection was microfilmed, and the originals disposed of by state approved method.

Due to the immensity of the collection, Record Group 273 was divided into twenty-four series reflecting the division of the department throughout its existence. The largest series include the Central Office records (Commissioner and Assistant Commissioners files); Division of Negro Education; Divisions of Elementary and High School Education, and the records of the State Board of Education. The duties and responsibilities of each appear below. The arrangement within each series remains the same throughout the record group.

The collection is composed of applications, correspondence, school and financial reports, and subject files. The correspondence, in keeping with the original order as much as possible, is filed alphabetically by the sender or by topic. Topical correspondence, such as letters dealing with segregation, was not separated, but was maintained in the original filing system. There is very little correspondence before 1900, and very little after 1960. Routine office correspondence, such as letters of request, has been sampled and the majority disposed of.

The bulk of the collection consists of the large number of reports generated by the Department. The reports fall into several categories, and may be found in the corresponding series. The reports provide important information on one and two room schools that no longer exist, and show the condition of Tennessee schools during the early years of public education. The most common of the reports include:

- (1) The Annual Statistical Reports, dating back to the 1870s, provide details concerning local schools and school systems, average daily attendance, number of school teachers, education levels of teachers, and student populations;
- (2) Approved School Reports were the yearly reports submitted by the schools in order to meet the requirements for public school accreditation. The reports are found in the Central Office series. The records date from the mid-1970s and are not complete;

- (3) Superintendent's Reports were submitted each year to the State by the County School Superintendents, and provide such information as school enrollment, average daily attendance, and other statistical information similar to the Annual Statistical Reports;
- (4) Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools Reports begin in 1932 and continue through 1937. These reports provide the most detail concerning the day to day activities of the schools in the state. In each report is to be found descriptions of the school building, sanitary facilities, age of building, names and education levels of teachers, library facilities, and other maintenance items;
- (5) Jeanes Supervisor's Reports are particularly important for the historian researching African American education in Tennessee in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The Jeanes Agency, along with the Rosenwald Fund, was a philanthropic organization established to build and maintain schools and libraries in the poor, racially segregated sections of the South. Each month "Jeanes supervisors" were sent to the counties to report on the progress and condition of each "Jeanes school." An important element of these reports is the schoolhouse photographs that were attached to a selected number of the Jeanes reports.

The largest number of applications is the Rural School Standardization Applications. Before a school could be "graded," it had to provide a detailed application describing the condition of the school. These applications were used for white and African-American schools. The researcher should also consult the photograph attached to the application. The subject files detail the various activities of the department. The subject files are arranged alphabetically within each series, and may include correspondence, handwritten notes, pamphlets, photographs, and other materials. All state publications were removed and deposited in the holdings of the State Library.

The records found in the Tennessee Department of Education provide an extremely important view of education in this state in the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century. Although weak in the periods before 1930, the other Department of Education record groups may be consulted to help fill in missing gaps. As one of the largest public record collections, it may prove to be one of the most important, not only to genealogists, but local historians as well.

## **Series List and Description**

### **Series I: Central Office    Boxes 1-30**

This series contains census enumerations, correspondence, reports, and subject files. The date range of the series is 1922 through 1977. This series contains census enumerations of schools and school attendance for the Tennessee counties. Only two years are covered, 1929 and 1933. There is general office correspondence, including correspondence from three Tennessee governors, Gordon Browning, Buford Ellington, and Frank Clement. The correspondence dates from 1949 through 1979. The bulk of the series is composed of reports. The Annual Statistical Reports in this series begin in 1922 and conclude in 1954. They provide general statistics from the county schools, including monies spent, number of students, teacher-pupil ratios, and other information. Approved School Reports are not complete and only cover the years 1976 through 1980. They are the latest reports found in the collection. The Crippled Children Enumeration included reports giving detailed descriptions of physical handicapped children who were eligible for State aid. This report provided the name of the child, the names of the parents, the disability, and other relevant information. The reports are available for the years 1929, 1937, 1948, and one county (Rhea) in 1951. The Superintendent's Reports and the County Trustee Reports provide general information similar to the Annual Statistical Reports. They cover the years 1924 through 1953. There is a gap in the years 1930 through 1953.

### **Series II: Division of Certification    Box 31**

This series contains six bound volumes describing the method of certification of teachers at the George Peabody College for Teachers, Nashville; Madison College, Madison; and the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. They date from 1953 through 1955.

### **Series III: Division of Curriculum and Supervision    Boxes 32-34**

This series contains two types of reports. The County Teacher Supervisor's Reports and the Preliminary Reports from High Schools of Tennessee. The reports document the teaching of required core subjects in the local public schools. The reports range in date from 1957 through 1971.

### **Series IV: Division of Elementary Schools    Boxes 35-52**

This series ranges in date from 1939 through 1953. The Approved Rural School Applications were submitted to the State in order for the "approved" elementary schools to continue funding for the next school term. Approval or disapproval was then granted by the State Board of Education. The applications are extant for only one school term, 1939-1940. Photographs, showing the condition of the school, were attached to the applications. The applications provide important information concerning the school, the names of the teachers, the physical structure of the building, class schedules and other information. The Elementary School Supervisor's Reports date from 1939 through 1950.

The Supervisor's reports detail teaching activities of the teaching staff, and the maintenance of standards set by the State Board of Education. Of a similar nature are the Rural Elementary School Standardization Reports. These reports, dating only during the 1942-1943 term, are incomplete. The correspondence includes letters from the director of the programs, as well as supporting correspondence from the various counties. An interesting series of reports are the "War Service Reports." These reports detail the role the elementary schools played in the "war effort" during World War II.

**Series V: Division of Finance and Administrative Services Box 53**

This series is composed entirely of the Financial Reports of the Superintendent of Schools. The reports cover only the 1968-1969 school term and are similar to the other Superintendent reports throughout the collection. They include both city and county school systems.

**Series VI: Future Farmers of America Box 54**

The series is composed entirely of subject files. The subject files are composed of brochures, reports, lists, and correspondence concerning the Future Farmers of America annual state conventions. The date range in this series is from 1952 through 1964.

**Series VII: Division of Health Education Box 55**

This series is composed of a small amount of correspondence and subject files concerning the Division of Health Education. The majority of the information concerns health education workshops and conferences. The date range of this series is 1947 through 1952.

**Series VIII: Division of High Schools Boxes 56-89**

This series is composed of correspondence, reports, and subject files. The date range of this series is 1922 through 1951. The correspondence contains a large amount of material from the counties. This correspondence, usually sent from the County Superintendent or Supervisor, describes the state of education in Tennessee counties from 1933 through 1951. It is arranged by county, as well as the name of the high school. There are several types of reports found in this series. The Inspection Reports are arranged by county and cover the years 1935 through 1952. The reports document the condition of the high school to determine the "grade" the school would receive. The Principal's Annual Reports (1923-1942) are similar to the Superintendent's reports, but focus on individual high schools, thus providing a great deal more details. The Reports of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools were submitted in order for the school to receive a yearly approval rating. They provide similar information as other reports, including school staff, education levels of teachers, and curriculum information. These reports date from 1930 through 1955. The subject files include lists of high school principals, information concerning the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary



Schools, and a special program concerning the teaching of “tuberculosis units” in the high schools.

**Series IX: Division of Home Economics Box 90**

This series consists almost entirely of correspondence. The large majority of the correspondence is from Margaret Browder, Director of the Division of Home Economics. There are several miscellaneous reports describing home economics classes in Tennessee schools. The date range of the series is 1933 through 1934.

**Series X: Division of Instructional Administration Boxes 91-92**

The reports in this series continue the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary School Reports. The date range for the series is 1953 through 1958. The reports are the same as those found in the Division of High School series. They are available for 1956 through 1958. There are several important subject files. The most important historically may be the file on segregation in Tennessee.

**Series XI: Division of Negro Education Boxes 93-111**

This series is composed of applications, correspondence, reports, and subject files. The date range of the series is 1933 through 1945. There is a large amount of applications in this series. The bulk of them are composed of the Rural Elementary School Standardization Applications (1938-1942). They are the same applications as used in the Division of Elementary Schools, but describe African American schools. Like the other applications, in many cases, a photograph has been attached to the application. The applications are arranged by county. The correspondence is generally concerning the work of the Jeanes supervisors and teachers throughout the state. It is important because it involves firsthand accounts of the conditions of African American schools in Tennessee that may not be found in the reports. There is also important correspondence from R. E. Clay and W. E. Turner, important figures in this Division. The Jeanes Supervisor's Reports provide a day-by-day description of the activities of each school, including workshops, community gatherings, subjects taught, and other school related items. They are arranged by the Jeanes Supervisor's name and range from 1936 through 1948. It should be noted that several counties may be covered in one report.

**Series XII: Division of Research and Statistics Boxes 112-122**

This series details the research element of the Division of Research and Statistics. The date range of the series is 1934 through 1935. Included in the series are the questionnaires used in compiling research reports. The reports range in date from 1933 through 1935.

### **Series XIII: Division of Rural Schools Box 123**

This series is composed of a small amount of correspondence and subject files. The material in this series dates from 1934 through 1940.

### **Series XIV: Division of School Finances Boxes 124-131**

This series is composed of applications, correspondence, school financial reports, and County Trustee Reports. The date range of the series is 1932 through 1938. The correspondence is important because it falls in the years 1932 through 1933, and details the plight of school systems during the Great Depression. The correspondence should be used in conjunction with the school financial reports. The school financial reports and the County Trustee Reports are similar in nature to other reports in the collection. The date range for the reports is 1933 through 1938. The subject files contain some financial information concerning the State's colleges and normal schools.

### **Series XV: Division of Schoolhouse Planning Boxes 132-135**

This series is composed of correspondence and reports. The series ranges from 1933 through 1938. The correspondence in this series is arranged by county. It primarily consists of county superintendents describing the need for new buildings in the local school systems. Some of the correspondence details new construction programs underway at the time. The correspondence dates from 1932 through 1938. The School Building Rehabilitation Program reports are arranged by county and cover only one year, 1935.

### **Series XVI: State Board of Education Boxes 136-152**

This series includes correspondence, deeds, minutes and subject files. The material in this series dates from 1924 through 1968. The correspondence is general in nature and includes correspondence from Commissioners of Education, as well as members of the State Board of Education. It dates from 1927 through 1959. In the series are photocopies of deeds from the state universities. The deeds reflect purchases of land adjoining the specific universities. The largest groups of deeds are from Memphis State University. The importance of this series is found in the State Board of Education minutes. The minutes date from 1924 through 1957, although there are some gaps in years. The subject files include information concerning the state institutions of higher learning, especially audit and financial reports. There are lists of college graduates in the years 1937 and 1961-1965. The researcher interested in the history of desegregation should consult the segregation subject files.

### **Series XVII: State Superintendent of Schools Boxes 153-155**

This series reflects the oldest records in the collection. The series is composed of applications, correspondence, school reports and subject files. The date range of this series is 1874 through 1921. The applications were requests to the Peabody Endowment for financial aid for local schools. They cover one school term (1876-1877) and are not available for all counties. The correspondence is general office correspondence from the State Superintendents of Schools. The school reports, arranged by county, are not as detailed as the other reports for later years. The reports primarily list county districts and the number of pupils, teachers, etc. They exist only for the years 1874, 1877, 1890, 1899, and 1905.

### **Series XVIII: Tennessee Education Commission Boxes 156-159**

This series is composed of clippings, correspondence, minutes, reports, and subject files. The material in this series dates from 1933 through 1934. The correspondence is general, relating to the activities of the commission. The minutes cover the entire operating time of the commission (1933-1934). The reports and subject files reflect the activities of the Tennessee Education Commission. Its role was solely a fact-finding mission. The final reports are found in the subject files. Bound copies of the report are found in the Library Section, Tennessee State Library and Archives.

### **Series XIX: Tennessee Emergency Relief Administration Box 160**

Included in this series are "Age and Training Enrollments." The date range for this series is 1933 through 1935. During the Great Depression, those who were unemployed were assisted in job training. These reports reflect this work of the Tennessee Emergency Relief Administration. They are available for only the year 1935.

### **Series XX: Tennessee School for the Blind Box 161**

The most important part of this series will be the lists of blind Tennesseans under 20 in 1940. There is also included in this series a budget report, as well as legislative appropriation information. The date range for this series is 1937 through 1941.

### **Series XXI: Tennessee Textbook Commission Box 162**

This series is composed of correspondence, minutes, a report, and subject files. The date range for this series is 1919 through 1958. The correspondence includes letters from Governor Austin Peay and information concerning rulings from the State Attorney General's Office. The Tennessee Textbook Commission minutes are incomplete and cover only the years 1955 through 1958.

**Series XXII: Division of Veterans Education Box 163**

This series is composed entirely of Reports of Supervision. The date range of this series is 1952 through 1960. The reports details about the curriculum being taught to the veteran, class size, curriculum, and names of instructors.

**Series XXIII: Division of Vocational Education Boxes 164-171**

The records in this series reflect the growth of vocational education in Tennessee. The series is composed of correspondence, annual reports, Descriptive Reports, Home Economics Reports, and Trade School Reports. The date range for this series is 1928 through 1960. The annual reports (1934-1957) detail the monies spent for vocational education in Tennessee, as well as the number of students being served in the vocational education programs. The Home Economics Reports (1930-1931) describe the home economics programs in the local schools in Tennessee. Information concerning the "On the Farm Training" Programs may be found in the subject files.

**Series XXIV: Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Boxes 172-175**

This series is composed of applications, correspondence, and subject files. The date range of this series is 1923 through 1960. The important aspect of this series is the applications. The applicants are those who applied for vocational rehabilitation through the Department of Education. They cover the years 1923-1931, and are not complete.

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This series contains notes, correspondence, and agendas from meetings and events Commissioner McElrath attended from 1983 and 1987.
