INTRODUCTION

Homecoming '86 was first introduced by Governor Lamar Alexander in his inaugural speech given on January 15, 1983, as a way to get people involved in their communities. Alex Haley and Minnie Pearl served as Honorary chairpersons. In addition to community involvement for the year 986, Homecoming '86 was to serve as a planning event for Tennessee's Bicentennial celebration to be held in 1996.

Initially, thirty-nine communities served as pilot communities, with almost 700 ultimately taking part in the Homecoming '86 celebration activities. Communities were asked to work on projects pertaining to their individual heritage. Additionally, there were sixteen state-wide projects that were undertaken: Homecoming in the Schools; Tennessee Roots; Tennessee Storytelling Project; Tennessee Literacy Festival; Tennessee Music Project; Tennessee Centenarian Project; Performing Arts Series; Heritage Project; Hometown Pride Project; Homecoming Arts Collection; Look Ahead Tennessee Conference; Memphis Rock-n-Roll, Rhythm and Blues Conference; Red Grooms Art Exhibit; Outstanding Scientists and Engineers; News Media Reunion; and "Comin' Home, Tennessee" Musical/Theatrical Production. One additional project that occurred was a Tennessee Homecoming '86 "Special" Train that traveled across the state from May 19 - 23, 1986. Finally, each "official" community received a "Homecoming Tree," which was a Tulip Poplar, to be planted in the community.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Record Group 278, State Planning Commission, Homecoming '86 Office, Audio/Video Collection consists of audiocassettes, videocassettes, slides, and photographic negatives, spanning the time period of 1985-1986. The collection contains material relating to the Homecoming activities that took place across the state and is broken down into four distinct series; Audio; Slides; Video/Film; Train Contact (Negative) Sheets.

The Audio Series consists of audiocassettes and some phonograph records from individuals and musical groups that were interested in developing a theme song for Homecoming '86. The song that was chosen as the theme song was "Comin' Home, Tennessee" by H. Jackson Browne. Also included are audiocassettes of Public Service Announcements that aired during Homecoming '86, featuring Alex Haley, Minnie Pearl, Dinah Shore, Crystal Gayle, and Lee Greenwood. Finally, there are audiocassettes to accompany three different slide show presentations, "Good Economics," "Food And The Prehistoric Indians Of Tennessee," and "The History Of Food In Tennessee".

The Slide Series consist of slide shows and miscellaneous slides that were shown during Homecoming '86. Included are the "Good Economics," "Food And The Prehistoric Indians Of Tennessee," and "The History Of Food In Tennessee" presentations. Also included are slides relating to the Woodland in Waverly Home Tour held in Nashville.

The Video/Film series consists of advertisements and Public Service Announcements pertaining to Homecoming '86, as well as various programs that occurred across the state. A portion of the videocassettes are in VHS format, but a large part of the collection is in Umatic format, which was a format used from around 1971 through the mid 1980's and requires a video player dedicated for this format. Also included in this series are 2 copies of the film "3000 Places," which were used as a promotion and were sent across the state to various groups that requested them. A VHS copy of this film, both with and without the introduction, is included in the collection.

The final series, Train Contact (negative) Sheets, consists of negatives of photographs that were taken in conjunction with the Homecoming '86 "Special" Train. The negatives are broken down by identified cities, and then a large group of unknown locations. This is only a small portion of the negatives available concerning the train. The largest portion of these negatives are included in Record Group 171, and are located in the vault, location I-B-1v.
